ALA/PLA and Google Digital Skills Grant Program

The American Library Association (ALA) and the Public Library Association (PLA) are partnering with Google on a Digital Skills grant program for libraries throughout the 50 States. The grant will be for \$1,000 toward programming in the area of Assisting Job Seekers to Find or Prepare for Work and/or Empower Small Businesses to Grow Online.

This grant program has a quick turnaround and implementation process. The application for each state will be open for four weeks only. View the

application steps on the <u>PLA website</u>. ALA and PLA will fund 5-25 libraries in each state. Currently the application for Pennsylvania is open and can be viewed from ALA as a PDF.



Once recaps of programs are received,

all grantee libraries will be entered into a secondary selection process. Based on the effectiveness and impact of the programs they implemented, at least one library in each state will be awarded an additional \$3,000, with further expectations that the library will help promote its work with ALA, PLA and Google.
